Grand Cru Classé  
Saint-Emilion

Château Larmande is one of the oldest estates in Saint-Émilion. Its history dates to at least 1585: it is a vineyard that has stood the test of time without ever losing its authenticity. The first acquisition of La Mondiale Grands Crus in 1990, Château Larmande embraces an unchanging link to the past, which gives it a unique place in the landscape of Saint Emilion. These diverse and vibrant terroirs have stood the test of time, producing lively, authentic and elegant wines.

With its seductive silky texture and charming bright fruit aromas, it is a classic expression of Saint-Émilion merlot and cabernets. Vintage after vintage, it surprises and delights.

**Grape Varieties:** 70% merlot, 25% cabernet franc, and 5% cabernet sauvignon

## 2025 Vintage

**Blend:** 83% merlot, 16% cabernet franc, 1% cabernet sauvignon

**Alcohol:** 13.5% Vol.

**Area in production:** 17 hectares

**Yields:** 35 hL/ha

**Harvest and Winemaking:** Hand-harvested from September 5th to 20th. Density sorting followed by gravity flow transfer of the grapes. Gentle extractions with cold pre-fermentation maceration. Vinification in temperature-controlled rectangular stainless steel tanks.

**Aging:** 15 months in a range of vessels (new oak barrels, one-year-old barrels, amphoras, and stainless-steel tanks)
